A LIFE DEVOTED TO RESEARCH THRU FACTS OBSERVATION

• His research strategy :

"Molecular analysis but only after the observation of facts"

- 3 major findings on cardiovascular diseases :
 - MONTREAL: From his first works as Professor of Pathology in Montreal, Serge pointed diet (saturated fats) as key factor in the development of thrombosis
 - INSERM LYON: Caravan Lab visiting Moselle, Var, Belgium, Wales, Scotland: the effect of alpha-linolenic acid on the reduction of platelets aggregates
 - COHORT STUDY IN NANCY: 100 000 subjects during 20 Years: The Cretan diet reduces cardiac death by 76%

AN INTERNATIONAL EXPOSURE: THE FRENCH PARADOX

- CBS « 60 minutes » program 1991 by Morley Safer: Watched by 50 millions Americans
- Numerous conferences in Paris and around the world: with Morley Safer and Dr Féraud (COREVI, Provence) / 1992 in Paris
- **Cancers and Alzheimer's program** financially helped by ANR Paris with **Dr Lanzmann** after he had to suffer an AVC stroke.
